Warwick Arts Centre is situated at the heart of the University of Warwick in Coventry. One of the largest arts centres in the UK with audiences that number 200,000+ a year, it's much more than a single venue:

Butterworth Hall has recently undergone a £8m refurbishment, with new seating, new stage, improved acoustic and access, plus fantastic new dressing rooms, artist facilities and rehearsal space. The Hall has a maximum capacity of 1850 for flat floor standing and balcony seated events. The Hall has a large tension wire grid for easy access for lighting and rigging, an outstanding natural acoustic.

The Theatre seating up to 550 and stages the best national and international plays and performances, as well as contemporary and international dance, music and comedians.

Studio with an intimate feel, this 180 capacity theatre has a flexible seating arrangement, which suits small-scale theatre, comedians and the occasional music event.

Cinema offers the best technical facilities in independent cinema 364 days a year. The 220 seater Cinema also features live stage event from other venues such as the National Theatre and the Metropolitan Opera (?)

Mead Gallery is one of the biggest exhibition spaces in the Midlands, the Mead is a cool, white, light space presenting touring shows and newly curated exhibitions.

Helen Martin Studio is the new flexible space can be used as a performance venue, rehearsal room or education workshop.

Travel Notes:

By Car: the centre is well signed posted off the A 41: a few miles west from the M6, M42 and east the M1.

Public transport from the Coventry station: the No 12 bus starts outside the station and finishes directly outside the Arts centre. Runs every 10 min, allow 15 min for the journey
